NOTE 1. NATURE AND BACKGROUND OF BUSINESS

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared for Exxe Group Inc. in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). In the opinion of management, all adjustments (consisting of normal recurring accruals) considered necessary for a fair presentation of the financial statements have been included. The financial statements include acquired subsidiaries, as discussed below, and include all consolidation entries required to include those subsidiaries.

The production of these financial statements completely relies on the furnishing of relevant information and corresponding documentation by management and, without an audit of this underlying information and documentation, the results shown are the opinion of management.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the Balance Sheet and Statement of Cash Flows, all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less are considered to be cash equivalents. The Company had no cash equivalents as of December 31, 2024, or December 31, 2023.

Income Taxes

Income taxes are provided in accordance with the FASB Accounting Standards (ASC 740), Accounting for Income Tax. A deferred tax asset or liability is recorded for all temporary differences between financial and tax reporting and net operating loss carryforwards. Any deferred tax expense (benefit) resulting from the net change during the year is shown as deferred tax assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets are reduced by a valuation allowance when, in the opinion of management, it is more likely than not that some portion or all of the deferred tax assets will not be realized. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are adjusted for the effects of changes in tax laws and rates on the date of enactment.

Basic and Diluted Net Income (Loss) Per Share

Net income (loss) per unit is calculated in accordance with Codification topic 260, "Earnings per Share" for the periods presented. Basic net loss per share is computed using the weighted average number of common membership units outstanding. Diluted loss per share has not been presented because the shares of common stock equivalents have not been included in the per share calculations as such inclusion would be anti-dilutive. Diluted earnings per share are based on the assumption that all dilutive stock options, warrants, and convertible debt are converted or exercised applying the treasury stock method. Under this method, options, warrants, and convertible debt are assumed exercised at the beginning of the period (or at the time of issuance, if later), and as if funds obtained thereby were used to purchase shares of common stock at the average market price during the period. Options, warrants, and/or convertible debt will have a dilutive effect during periods of net profit only when the average market price of the units during the period exceeds the exercise or conversion price of the items.

Stock-Based Compensation

Codification topic 718 "Stock Compensation" requires that the cost resulting from all share-based transactions be recorded in the financial statements and establishes fair value as the measurement objective for share-based payment transactions with employees and acquired goods or services from non-employees. The codification also provides guidance on valuing and expensing these awards, as well as disclosure requirements of these equity arrangements. The Company adopted the codification upon creation of the Company and will expense share-based costs in the period incurred. The Company has not yet adopted a stock option plan and all share-based transactions and share-based compensation has been expensed in accordance with the codification guidance.

Convertible Instruments

The Company evaluates and accounts for conversion options embedded in its convertible instruments in accordance with professional standards for "Accounting for Derivative Instruments and Hedging Activities". Professional standards generally provide three criteria that, if met, require companies to bifurcate conversion options from their host instruments and account for them as free-standing derivative financial instruments. These three criteria include circumstances in which (a) the economic characteristics and risks of the embedded derivative instruments are not clearly and closely related to the economic characteristics and risks of the host contract, (b) the hybrid instrument that embodies both the embedded derivative instrument and the host contract is not re-measured at fair value under otherwise applicable generally accepted accounting principles with changes in fair value reported in earnings as they occur and (c) a separate instrument with the same terms as the embedded derivative instrument would be considered a derivative instrument. Professional standards also provide an exception to this rule when the host instrument is deemed to be conventional as defined under professional standards as "The Meaning of Conventional Convertible Debt Instrument".

The Company accounts for convertible instruments when it has determined that the embedded conversion options should not be bifurcated from their host instruments in accordance with professional standards when "Accounting for Convertible Securities with Beneficial Conversion Features," as those professional standards pertain to "Certain Convertible Instruments." Accordingly, the Company records, when necessary, discounts to convertible notes for the intrinsic value of conversion options embedded in debt instruments based upon the differences between the fair value of the underlying shares of common stock at the commitment date of the note transaction and the effective conversion price embedded in the note. Debt discounts under these arrangements are amortized over the term of the related debt to their earliest date of redemption. The Company also records when necessary deemed dividends for the intrinsic value of conversion options embedded in preferred shares of common stock based upon the differences between the fair value of the underlying shares at the commitment date of the note transaction and the effective conversion price embedded in the note.

ASC 815-40 provides that, among other things, generally, if an event not within the entity's control could require net cash settlement, then the contract shall be classified as an asset or a liability.

Fair Value of Financial Instruments

We adopted the guidance of ASC-820 for fair value instruments, which clarifies the definition of fair value, prescribes methods for determining fair value, and establishes a fair value hierarchy to classify the inputs used in measuring fair value, as follows:

Level 1	Inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities available at the measurement date.
Level 2	Inputs are quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in markets that are not active, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable, and inputs derived from or corroborated by observable market data.
Level 3	Inputs are unobservable inputs which reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions on what assumptions the market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability based on the best available information.

The carrying amounts for cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued expenses, and loans payable approximate their fair value based on the short-term maturity of these instruments. We did not identify any assets or liabilities that are required to be presented on the balance sheet at fair value in accordance with the accounting guidance.

ASC 825-10 "Financial Instruments" allows entities to voluntarily choose to measure certain financial assets and liabilities at fair value (fair value option). The fair value option may be elected on an instrument-by-instrument basis and is irrevocable unless a new election date occurs. If the fair value option is elected for an instrument, unrealized gains and losses for that instrument should be reported in earnings at each subsequent reporting date. We did not elect to apply the fair value option to any outstanding instruments.

Derivative Liabilities

Derivative financial instruments consist of convertible instruments and rights to shares of the Company's common membership units. The Company assessed that it had no derivative financial instruments as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

ASC 815 generally provides three criteria that, if met, require companies to bifurcate conversion options from their host instruments and account for them as free-standing derivative financial instruments. These three criteria include circumstances in which (a) the economic characteristics and risks of the embedded derivative instrument are not clearly and closely related to the economic characteristics and risks of the host contract, (b) the hybrid

instrument that embodies both the embedded derivative instrument and the host contract is not re-measured at fair value under otherwise applicable generally accepted accounting principles with changes in fair value reported in earnings as they occur and (c) a separate instrument with the same terms as the embedded derivative instrument would be considered a derivative instrument subject to the requirement of ASC 815. ASC 815 also provides an exception to this rule when the host instrument is deemed to be conventional, as described.

Recent Accounting Pronouncements

Accounting Pronouncement Adopted

In October 2021, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2021-08, "Business Combinations (Topic 805): Accounting for Contract Assets and Contract Liabilities from Contracts with Customers," which requires entities to apply Topic 606 to recognize and measure contract assets and contract liabilities in a business combination as if the acquiring entity had originated the contracts. The standard is effective for public companies for fiscal years, and interim periods within those fiscal years, beginning after December 15, 2022. The Company adopted this accounting standard effective January 1, 2023 with no impact on the consolidated financial statements.

In June 2022, the FASB issued ASU 2022-03, "Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Fair Value Measurement of Equity Securities Subject to Contractual Sale Restrictions," which clarifies that contractual sale restrictions are not considered in measuring fair value of equity securities and requires additional disclosures for equity securities subject to contractual sale restrictions. The standard is effective for public companies for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2023. Early adoption is permitted. The Company adopted this accounting standard effective September 30, 2024 with no material impact on the consolidated financial statements.

Accounting Pronouncement Pending Adoption

In October 2023, the FASB issued ASU 2023-06 "Disclosure Improvements: Codification Amendments in Response to the SEC's Disclosures Update and Simplification Initiative". The guidance amends certain disclosure and presentation requirements related to the statement of cash flows, accounting changes and error corrections, earnings per share, interim reporting, commitments, debt, equity, derivatives, transfers and services and various industry specific guidance. For entities subject to the SEC's existing disclosure requirements, the effective date for each amendment will be the date on which the SEC's removal of that related disclosure from Regulation S-X or Regulation S-K becomes effective. However, if by June 30, 2027, the SEC has not removed the existing disclosure requirements, the amendments will not become effective. Early adoption is not permitted. The Company is still assessing the impacts to its consolidated financial statements.

In November 2023, the FASB issued ASU 2023-07 "Segment Reporting (Topic 280): Improvements to Reportable Segment Disclosures". The amendments require entities to

disclose significant segment expenses impacting profit and loss that are regularly provided to the chief operating decision maker. In addition, the amendments enhance interim disclosure requirements, clarify circumstances in which an entity can disclose multiple segment measures of profit or loss, provide new segment disclosure requirements for entities with a single reportable segment, and contain other disclosure requirements. The update is required to be applied retrospectively to prior periods presented, based on the significant segment expense categories identified and disclosed in the period of adoption. The amendments are required to be adopted for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2023, and interim periods within fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2024 with early adoption permitted. The Company is still assessing the impacts to its consolidated financial statements.

In December 2023, the FASB issued ASU No. 2023-09 "Improvements to Income Tax Disclosures (Topic 740)". The ASU requires companies to break out their income tax expense, income tax rate reconciliation and income tax payments made in more detail. For public companies, the requirements will become effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2024, with early adoption permitted. The Company is still assessing the impacts to its consolidated financial statements.

In December 2023, the FASB issued ASU 2023-08 "Intangibles—Goodwill and Other—Crypto Assets (Subtopic 350-60) Accounting for and Disclosure of Crypto Assets". ASU 2023-08 will require entities to measure crypto assets that meet the scope criteria at fair value and to reflect changes in fair value in net income each reporting period. The amendments in ASU 2023-08 will also require entities to present crypto assets measured at fair value separately from other intangible assets on the balance sheet and changes in the fair value measurement of crypto assets separately from changes in the carrying amounts of other intangible assets on the income statement. The amendments in the ASU are effective for all entities for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2024, including interim periods within those fiscal years. Early adoption is permitted for both interim and annual financial statements that have not yet been issued or made available for issuance. The Company is still assessing the impacts to its consolidated financial statements.

Impact of New Accounting Standards

The Company does not expect the adoption of recently issued accounting pronouncements to have a significant impact on the Company's results of operations, financial position, or cash flow.

NOTE 3. GOING CONCERN

Exxe Group Inc. (\$AXXA) has significantly reduced debt, restructured client business relationships, and maintains a working capital surplus of \$9,967,381 as of December 31, 2024. However, legacy debt obligations and capital expenditures continue to impact cash accumulation at the parent company level.

The Company remains financially stable, with ongoing revenue growth driven by profit-sharing agreements with onboarded businesses, enhancing cash flow and financial flexibility. While sufficient liquidity exists for current operations, additional resources may be required to support expansion initiatives.

Risk Management & Capital Strategy

Exxe Group continues to explore strategic funding options, including structured financing and private placements, while prioritizing debt reduction and minimizing dilution. Future capital requirements will depend on: The pace of revenue generation from onboarded businesses. The Company's ability to optimize working capital and execute its growth strategy. Market conditions affecting funding availability.

Outlook

While there is no guarantee that financing will be secured on favorable terms, management remains confident in its ability to execute its short-term (12-month) and long-term growth plans. The Company has adopted a flexible financial strategy to adjust operations, maintain liquidity, and sustain profitability, ensuring resilience in varying market conditions.

NOTE 4. ACQUISITIONS AND INVESTMENTS

As of January 1, 2024, Exxe Group has shifted its focus from direct asset acquisitions to a profit-sharing and service-based business model. This transition optimizes financial sustainability, scalability, and operational efficiency, ensuring Exxe leverages its fintech, SaaS, and management consulting expertise.

To facilitate this, Exxe Group:

- 1. Reclassified certain assets, including licenses, software, contracts, and prepaid expenses.
- 2. Renegotiated agreements to focus on business consulting, management services, and licensing rights.

OTC Markets Group Inc.

3. Disposed of subsidiary Myle-One Beteiligungen AG and formed a Joint Venture (JV) for service-based revenue generation.

These structural improvements allow Exxe to scale operations more efficiently, enhance financial transparency, and streamline audit processes.

Joint Venture with Myle-One Beteiligungen AG (2024)

In January 2024, Exxe Group finalized a Joint Venture with Myle-One Beteiligungen AG to:

- 1. Onboard businesses into the Exxe platform, benefiting from fintech and management expertise.
- 2. Provide strategic consulting and management services rather than direct asset ownership.
- 3. Acquire licensing rights from Myle-One's underlying businesses for long-term value creation.

This partnership enhances operational scalability, revenue predictability, and investor confidence.

Blockchain & Al-Powered Solutions – Tokenization, Al-driven analytics, smart contract automation. Agribusiness & Commodities – Blockchain-based traceability for agricultural supply chains. Digital Media & Marketing – Content production, marketplace technology, Al-powered branding. Medical & Surgical Supply Chain – Blockchain-powered authenticity verification & distribution. Automotive & Parts Distribution – Tokenized authentication, blockchain-enhanced supply chains. Architectural & Interior Design – Al-driven design & manufacturing integration. Real Estate Portfolio & Tokenization Strategies. Exxe Group is actively onboarding and restructuring real estate projects through management consulting agreements instead of direct ownership. Various Real Estate Portfolios in Germany, Switzerland, and Spain. Blockchain Strategy: Exxe establishes a strategy to leverage blockchain technology to enhance liquidity, enable fractional ownership, and introduce new revenue-sharing models for assets which are in the process of onboarding in Exxe fintech management platform solution.

Exxe Group formed a series of agreements to acquire services from the Company's multiple existing and new service providers. The Company also reclassified certain assets including acquisitions and investments. License, software, contracts, and prepaid expenses, reflect these modifications. The Company disposed of a subsidiary, Myle-One Beteiligungen, AG, to minority interest holders while simultaneously forming a joint venture to provide certain services to client companies as well as acquiring multiple licenses including territory distribution. In addition, Exxe elected to modify these categories as a proper reflection of Exxe's established fintech, management consulting, and SaaS-type software competencies and capabilities in a unified platform. The above steps were intended to streamline operations and optimize Exxe's operations leading to the facilitation of overall audit processes.

Exxe's new classification/allocation of certain assets, include license, software, contracts, and prepaid expenses. The enhanced strategy involves growing business not by investing in assets and operating businesses but in acquisitions of management skills to provide them to an existing portfolio of assets, business, and companies. These included key industry segments

real estate, automotive, medical, architectural interior design, software, media, agriculture, and digital trading technologies. Exxe concluded the formation of a Joint Venture relationship with Myle-One to provide certain services to the businesses and assets via onboarding businesses to the management consulting and strategy platform provided by Exxe Group. In addition, Exxe Group acquired licensing rights from Myle-One's underlying assets and businesses. Exxe simultaneously entered into a management agreement to acquire via purchase or prepayment of management skills/competencies. Thus, services provision can be executed to the list of earlier acquired projects in a partnership with Myle-One.

The Company's acquired territory distribution includes licensing rights for businesses in the following industries: media, design, furniture, medical products, medical devices, automotive repair and products. Exxe also acquired territory distribution rights in additional, currently undisclosed industry segments.

As of March 31, 2024, the Company acquired core competencies and capabilities on a prepaid expense basis which can be offered through the Exxe platform via a service suite or application basis. Dozens of modules and services can be utilized under the following category suites. These include:

As of January 2024 Exxe Group, Inc and Myle-One Beteiligungen, AG Formed a Joint Venture agreement to jointly manage businesses and assets using Exxe Group methodology and a management and fintech platform. As of 2024 the agreements were renegotiated and the following skills were acquired: Media and Content, Interior Design, Biotech, Crypto and Blockchain, Canada Software. Telecom, Israel-based Software, Prop Trading, Kuwait representation, Car Parts and Automotive Services, Surgical Medical Supplies and Agribusiness.

Diversified Real Estate Portfolio: On June 20, 2018, December 10, 2018, January 15, 2019, and August 20, 2021 Real Estate Reaxxa: Hesse, Cp respectively, the company through its

currently a Joint Venture with Myle-One Beteiligungen, AG entered into an agreement to work on the following projects: Hesse NL Multi-Unit Development Project located in the Greater Frankfurt Area, Germany; Caesar Perini Universal Storage Box project located near Bern, Switzerland; Mortgages Portfolios.and a Regent Penthouse Duplex in Miami, Florida. On November 15, 2021, the company entered into an agreement to work a portfolio of Real Estate assets that consisted of multiple residential, commercial, and raw/undeveloped land parcels; portfolio locations including projects in Schweinfurt, Würzburg, Frankfurt in Germany as well as projects in Switzerland and Spain. Projects are currently onboarding into a Exxe/Myle One management platform, whereby Exxe provides expertise with original mortgages, cross-collateralization, lien holders, heirs and limited partners. Exxe Group's business model methodology is on-board real estate projects listed above into Exxe's management platform. The platform consists of software-in-development, management and other competencies through the Joint Venture with Myle-One Beteiligungen, AG.

On March 6, 2019, and February 13, 2020, On October 10, 2018, January 5, 2020 respectively, the Company acquired skills in Digital Communities, Software Technology, Software development, Venture Capital (VC) incubator. On March 6, 2019, April 15, 2019, March 30, 2021, Exxe Group acquired skills in the following projects the Festivals, Media content productions and distribution business, Led Marketplace, Digital Media and Marketing.

Platforms, AutoParts/Engine Repairs, Medical Distribution, Architectural, Interior Design: On February 13, 2020, the company formed agreements that as of January 2024 represented inlicense and management for Auto parts, and an engine repair business. The renegotiated arrangement includes licensing agreements and management agreements that provide profit sharing as part of the JV with MyleOne. Detailed terms for the new deal for the auto group will be announced as soon as new terms are finalized. October 5, 2020, the Company formed agreements that as of January 2024 represented in licenses and management for Medical/Surgical Distribution businesses. On May 20, 2021, the company formed an agreement that as of January 2024 represented in-licenses and management for a business focused on Architectural and Interior Design Business

Agricultural, Diverse Swap Systems: On April 15, 2019, and August 1, 2019, the Company formed an agreement to provide services to agricultural companies specializing in various seed to sale activities of crops trading operations. The Company also acquired rights and developed software technologies to assist in trading of alt-asset swaps. In 2024, Agricultural, Alternative and Digital Assets' Swaps and Trading Services transitioned under Recurring Consulting Services Category.

NOTE 5. LONG-TERM RECEIVABLES

On December 31, 2024, and March 31, 2024, the Company had interest in long-term receivables totaling \$7,717,549 and \$7,717,549 respectively, with various terms of maturity.

NOTE 6. FIXED ASSETS

All real estate investments are held as income-producing assets, with management services income booked to the statement of operations as earned on a monthly basis.

All investments made in intangible assets take the form of goodwill in the assets acquired. Goodwill is not amortized but will be tested on an annual basis for impairment and the value of the goodwill is written down accordingly if the value is below the carrying value in the financial statements.

Management Discussion and Analysis

Mission Statement

Exxe Group's mission is to redefine industries through innovation. By integrating cutting-edge technologies such as blockchain, Al,& diversified business strategies into business of traditional industries, Exxe's mission is to drive innovation, operational-efficiencies,& long term profitability while delivering value to investors and clients.

Business Strategy

As of March 31, 2024, the Company effected a refocused business strategy providing services to generate its revenue base. Management analysis determined that offering services versus asset acquisition held to maturity would allow its client company relationships to increase their business growth rates. This increased business growth at the client-level, as well as the addition of new client companies, would lead to increased demand for Exxe Management, Consulting Recurring Revenue and SaaS services in a shorter time-frame, and thus lead to increased revenue generation and growth rates for Exxe itself.

In order to effect the revised business strategy, Exxe Group disposed of Myle-One Beteiligungen, AG to minority interest holders while simultaneously forming a series of joint ventures, acquiring distribution licensing rights, as well as acquiring core competencies and

capabilities on a prepaid expense basis. The Company also reclassified certain assets including acquisitions and investments as a combination of licenses, software, and contracts. The reclassifications and reallocations optimize Exxe's operations and also lead to the facilitation of the overall audit processes.

Full details are available in Note 4.

General Business and Economic Conditions

The company is currently anticipating inflation around the 3% mark in 2025-2026 and a series of moves by both the Federal Reserve and the current U.S. Administration in response. The Company has taken steps to prepare for a range of future market conditions, including potentially lower inflation if the U.S. DOGE Agency is effective in eliminating a sufficient amount of government spending, which directly impacts both headline and underlying inflation.

While U.S. economic indicators are not showing immediate stress, there may be divergences over the next 3-6 month period. Accordingly, Exxe continues to monitor market conditions while focusing on improving its own balance sheet and other metrics.

General economic stress may lead to new opportunities for Exxe to gain new licenses, software, and contracts as companies seek cost reductions or other efficiencies offered by Exxe Group's SaaS type offerings.

Corporate Liquidity

The Company remains focused on improving its balance sheet, liquidity, and debt-to-asset ratios. The combined impact the Company intends to achieve, is to boost liquidity and establish a capital cushion prior to any actual downturn in any of the markets which we serve.

Management has been working on a three-year strategy to reduce Exxe Group's debt load and improve its revenue base. This program has been ongoing since March 2022. The strategy was amended in March 2024 in light of the change in focus from asset ownership to services provisions to client companies, to include a new fourth-tier:

- debt reduction and debt rescheduling to minimize cash expenses and to reduce cash outflows
- deploying cash and near-liquid resources to support existing revenue-generating projects
- re-evaluating projects that require significant resource allocation, or require significant physical movement of material, and have high potential risk factors
- Disposing of tangible assets and refocusing the company asset base on a combination of licenses, software, and contracts

The Company continues to make improvements to its balance sheet, liquidity, and other key metrics. Total liabilities have been reduced by \$43.86 million from 68,312,081 in December 2022 to \$24,455,224 in December 2024. Total long-term debt over the same period was reduced by \$31.07 million from \$49,356,045 to \$18,288,350.

Average revenue per Quarter over the first three Quarters of FY-2025 is \$15,76 million. The Company is working on improving revenues while it maintains profitability, as it works through its new business model.

Longer-term trend changes have allowed the Company to boost liquidity and achieve a solid capital cushion, although further scope remains.

Management corporate goals are broadly focused on a blend of revenues, profits, and improved profit margins, along with further debt reductions.

Treasury Strategy

Exxe Group is enhancing its treasury strategy to accommodate recent accounting developments. In December 2023, the FASB issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2023-08 "Intangibles—Goodwill and Other—Crypto Assets (Subtopic 350-60) Accounting for and Disclosure of Crypto Assets". ASU 2023-08, among other things, allows companies to record gains held on cryptocurrencies. The ASU will apply to all entities with fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2024. Accordingly, the Company plans to allocate a portion of its cash reserves to Bitcoin (BTC).

Any purchases the Company may make will be opportunistic in nature and will not interfere with cash needs to support the company's multiple growth opportunities.

Common Share Repurchase Plan (CSRP) and Buyback

Exxe Group has a long-term share buyback strategy aimed at enhancing shareholder value while aligning with its growth trajectory. Approved on October 18, 2023, the Common Share Repurchase Plan (CSRP) authorizes open market and negotiated share repurchases under Rule 10b5-1 and Rule 10b-18 of the Securities Exchange Act.

While buybacks are a phased, long-term initiative, Exxe's aggressive business transformation plan is expected to enable greater capital allocation for repurchase purposes within 12-18 months. Quarterly disclosures will reflect share buyback activity.

As of December 30, 2024, Exxe has:

- 1. Allocated initial funds for repurchases.
- 2. Engaged a broker-dealer to facilitate the process.
- 3. Established a dedicated buyback account.
- 4. Aligned overall company strategy with the internal timeline of execution of shares repurchases.

No shares were repurchased in the reporting period ending December 31, 2024, as Exxe strategically manages capital. The timing and volume of buybacks remain subject to financial performance and market conditions, ensuring efficient execution. All plans including timing and amounts are internal and subject to changing conditions.

Risk Management

Management completed a strategic evaluation of its active projects. This included assets that required significant resource allocation, or required significant physical movement of material, and / or had high potential risk factors.

As a result of the evaluation of all of the Company's projects, a decision was made to dispose of fixed assets that require significant capital allocation, and instead create a balance sheet primarily focused on licenses, software, and contracts.

The focus remains on optimizing existing revenue generating operations in order to maximize profitability, as well as to improve profit margins.

Minimal Share Issuances for Legacy Debt Obligations: While Exxe Group is progressing its plan, the Company must also fulfill legacy debt obligations from capital raises and acquisitions conducted in prior years.

These obligations require share issuances, which are: Part of pre-existing financial commitments, unrelated to the buyback program. Necessary to satisfy structured debt repayments from financing agreements made several years ago. Always part of disclosures . Conducted to ensure they do not significantly impact the company's ability to execute its long-term growth plan.

Cryptocurrency Risk Management Discussion

Any cryptocurrency evaluation includes ongoing assets not only from the standpoint of asset potential, but also from their short- and long-term capital needs, as well as their fit into the overall defined strategy. Therefore we may elect not to proceed with certain assets if our assessment is that those assets could result in constraints to our overall plan.

Audits

After multiple discussions between Exxe management and Fruci & Associates it was determined that the best interests of the company and the shareholders is for an audit of the entire company - Exxe Group, Inc. - at the parent level.

In addition, in order to expedite the Audit, the Company contemplated changing the corporate Year-nd to December from March. Following a review by Fruci, it was decided to keep the corporate year-end as March 31.

In addition, the Company approved providing financial statements for the first three quarters including the current quarter ending December 31, 2025. The last Quarter for yearly Audit will be provided to the Auditors when the Company completes financial disclosures for March 31, 2025.

Real Estate

Exxe Group's real estate strategy focuses primarily on providing management and other services to work on the real estate projects on boarded into Exxe/MyleOne platform. In addition licenses, software, and contracts are used to generate and expand its revenue base.

Agribusiness

Exxe Group's trading division that includes agribusiness and crypto swaps strategy refocused on utilizing licenses, contracts and software in order to provide RCS recurring consulting services. Revenues generated through this model are favorable for future expansion and audits.

Revenue Generating Acquisitions

From an acquisition perspective, Exxe Group primarily focuses on acquiring special skills and technologies to support its mission of delivering diversified service suites for digital and brick and mortar businesses through its proprietary, innovative platform. Exxe Group also lined up and intends to expand the diversified portfolio of client businesses in the upcoming quarters.

Goodwill and Intangibles

The company is actively evaluating its Goodwill and Intangibles in a continued effort to prepare for audits, improve the company's revenue generation and financial metrics. The corporate balance sheet broadly reflects the current strategy of focusing on licenses, contracts and software.

Dividend Policy

As of the current date Exxe Group does not issue cash dividends or distributions to its shareholders. The Company has agreed to re-invest some of its cash directly back into operations. This policy is similar to other companies operating in the tech space, who elect to redirect profits back into the company for growth and expansion.
