The holders of our common stock are entitled to one vote per share on all matters to be voted on by the stockholders. All shares of common stock are entitled to participate in any distributions or dividends that may be declared by the board of directors, subject to any preferential dividend rights of outstanding shares of preferred stock. Subject to prior rights of creditors, all shares of common stock are entitled, in the event of our liquidation, dissolution or winding up, to participate ratably in the distribution of all our remaining assets, after distribution in full of preferential amounts, if any, to be distributed to holders of preferred stock. There are no sinking fund provisions applicable to the common stock. Our common stock has no preemptive or conversion rights or other subscription rights.

4) Issuer's Business, Products and Services

A. Business Operations

Through its subsidiaries, the Company's current business operations consist of restaurant operations and beverages production, including beer and other non-alcoholic beverages. The company is currently constructing a 13,000 square foot "scale" beverages production plant, in which it intends to produce alcoholic beverages such as beer, hard seltzer, hard cider, and kombucha as well as non-alcoholic beverages such as teas and sodas. The company is currently exploring other opportunities such as those in the spirits (distilling) and wine industries.

C. 1812 Brewing Company (f/k/a Sackets Harbor Brewing Company)

1812 Brewing Company develops, produces, and markets micro brewed beers such as: War of 1812 Amber Ale Thousand Islands IPA, Malicious Intent XXIPA, Helles Bells Lager, Route 11 Lager, Wolves Den Cream Ale. Its War of 1812 Amber Ale or "1812 Amber Ale" is the company's flagship brand and was the winner of a Gold Medal and United States Winner in the 2025, 2023 & 2022 World Beer Awards, the Gold Medal Winner in the 2023 World Beer Championships, the Gold Medal in the 2022 Great International Beer, Cider, Mead & Sake Competition, the Silver Medal at the 2022 Annual Brewski Awards, and a Silver Medal and "New York Amber Ale Brewery of the Year" at the 2023 and the 2024 New York International Beer Competition. War of 1812 Amber Ale has been aggressively marketed to command a significant retail presence in the regional marketplace. Management estimates 1812 Ale is distributed to over 3,000 retail locations in New York and Florida. The Company's bottled and canned products are sold through wholesale distributors to consumers at supermarkets, warehouse stores, liquor stores, taverns and bars, restaurants, and convenience stores. Currently two of the Company's brands are also available on draft. The Company's products are delivered to retail outlets by independent distributors whose principal business is the distribution of beer and in some cases other alcoholic beverages, and who typically also distribute one or more national beer brands. Together with its distributors, the Company markets its products to retail outlets and relies on its distributors to provide regular deliveries, to maintain retail shelf space, and to oversee timely rotation of inventory. Production of the Company's beverages requires quantities of various agricultural products, including barley, hops, malt, and malted wheat for beer. The Company fulfills its commodities requirements through purchases from various sources, some through contractual arrangements and others on the open market.

Craft Beer and Spirits Industries

The craft beer and artisanal spirits sectors represent two of the most dynamic corners of the global beverage market - blending creativity, community, and premiumization into powerful investment stories. While both industries share roots in small-scale production and authentic storytelling, their current trajectories highlight distinct opportunities for investors.

Craft Beer: Maturing but Still Evolving

The global craft beer market remains substantial, projected to reach \$242 billion by 2035, growing at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 8.2% (openpr.com). Consumers continue to gravitate toward locally brewed, flavorful, and experience-driven beverages, fueling demand for ales, lagers, and specialty experiments. Growth is strongest in microbreweries and taprooms, which provide experiential engagement and brand loyalty that mass brewers cannot easily replicate.

Artisanal Spirits: Accelerating Through Premiumization

Artisanal and craft-distilled spirits are experiencing a steep ascent. The global market is forecast to rise from \$42.5 billion in 2025 to \$185.8 billion by 2035, a 9.6% CAGR, driven by premiumization, innovation, and deeper consumer connections (makdatainsights.com).

Some estimates project even stronger short-term growth—28.4% CAGR from 2024–2030, reaching \$115.45 billion by 2030 (ainvest.com).

The appeal lies in economics and storytelling. Craft distilleries enjoy higher margins (often 58–65%), longer shelf lives, and flexibility in scaling distribution without cold-chain logistics. Consumers are increasingly drawn to authentic, locally rooted brands that emphasize provenance, sustainability, and craftsmanship—attributes that align well with modern ESG investing priorities. According to alibaba.com, these structural advantages have made artisanal spirits a better-performing category post-2020, with expanding export potential and strong premium pricing resilience.

The Investment Outlook

Investing in craft beverages today is ultimately an investment in authenticity, experience, and community identity. Craft beer continues to offer opportunities in regional brand consolidation, hospitality synergies, and hybrid models that blend brewing with experiences like food, music, and tourism. Meanwhile, craft spirits present faster scalability and potential for global brand formation, with premium whiskey, gin, rum, and agave spirits leading the charge.

Operators will succeed who combine passion with disciplined business models - leveraging direct-to-consumer channels, digital storytelling, and sustainable production practices. As consumers *trade quantity for quality*, both segments stand to benefit, though artisanal spirits currently hold the stronger growth promise from an investor's perspective.

The Promise of Consolidation in the Craft Beer and Spirits Industry

The craft beer and spirits sector has matured into one of the most dynamic segments of the beverage market. Once defined by small-scale innovation and local loyalty, the space is now entering a new phase—one driven by strategic acquisitions and thoughtful consolidation. For investors and operators alike, the opportunity lies in bringing together strong brands, scalable production, and shared distribution to unlock value that individual players often cannot achieve alone.

Market Landscape

The craft industry is maturing, and the marketplace is highly competitive. While consumer interest in authenticity and quality remains strong, growth has slowed as the market saturates. This creates fertile ground for consolidation:

profitable exits for founders and platform growth for acquirers who can leverage scale, efficiency, and brand synergies.

Strategic Rationale

Consolidation offers multiple strategic advantages:

- **Operational efficiencies** through shared sourcing, production facilities, and logistics infrastructure.
- **Portfolio diversification** across beer, wine, spirits, and ready-to-drink segments, helping smooth seasonal or category-specific volatility.
- **Expanded distribution** channels that can elevate small brands from regional recognition to national retail presence.
- **Marketing leverage** through unified storytelling and data-driven promotional strategies that remain authentic to each brand's identity.

Investor Opportunity

From a financial perspective, roll-ups in this space can generate value from margin expansion and revenue synergies, but the greatest long-term promise lies in building a portfolio of differentiated, premium brands. Consumers continue to seek originality and meaning in what they drink; acquirers who protect that individuality while improving scale can capture both profit and loyalty.

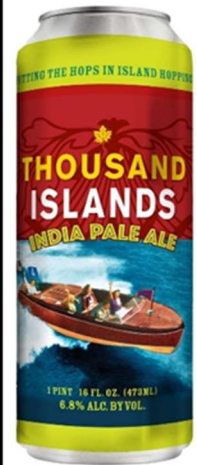
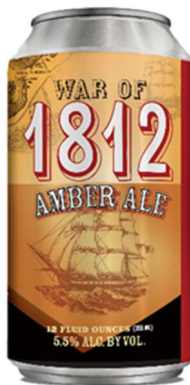
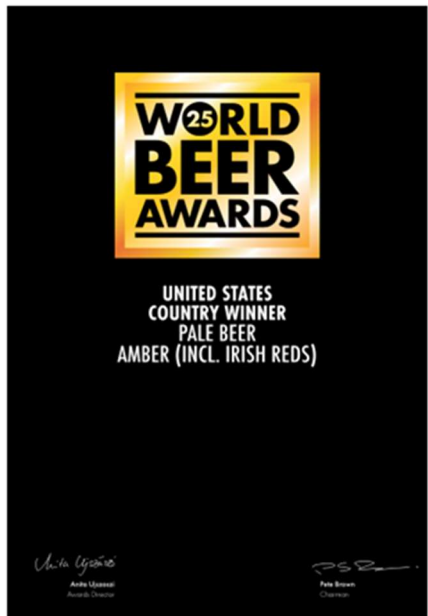
The Path Forward

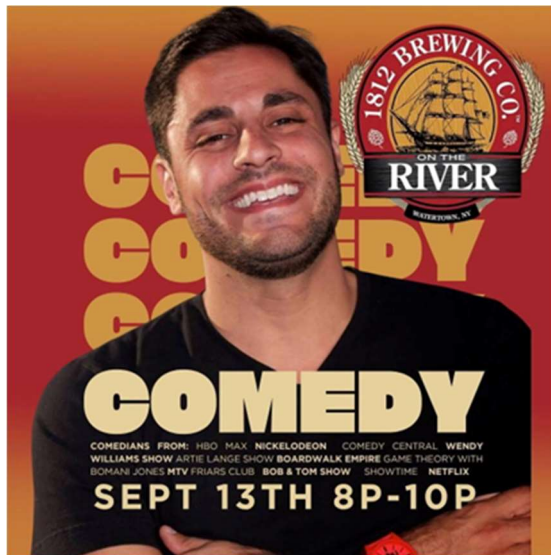
13,000 square foot production and bottling plant and offices. The Company is currently building out its commercial-scale brewery in which it shall keg and bottle and eventually can its own products as well as “contract” produce for third parties. 1812 Brewing Co. recently acquired larger-scale brewing systems, fermentation vessels and an automated bottling and labeling line for installation in its own 13,000 square foot plant located in the heart of the City of Watertown, NY, which is also 20 minutes from the Canadian border. This location will also have food and beverages for consumption on site.



500 Newell Street, Watertown, NY (owned)

On April 9, 2024, the Company acquired the business and real estate assets of the restaurant known as “Maggie’s on the River” located at 500 Newell Street, Watertown, NY for \$1.4 million plus the cost of the existing food and beverages at the time of purchase. Maggie’s, which will be re-branded at “**1812 on the River**” gives the Company key brand retail exposure in its base of Watertown, NY. Located at 500 Newell Street, the building is a renovated industrial space originally occupied by the former Red Lion Brewing Company. Subsequently, “Maggie’s” formed in about 2012 and re-established restaurant operations with full-service dining with 44 draft beer lines & \$325k in 2022 beer sales. 1812 on River is the City of Watertown’s only waterside dining with a 2nd and 3rd floors renovated for full use for dining and/or private parties.

Set against the waterfront backdrop of the Black River, 1812 on the River is a destination for private parties of all kinds and transforms into a lively entertainment hub featuring an lineup of live music and comedy.

Note 1 - Organization and Basis of Presentation

Organization

1812 Brewing Company, Inc. (the "Company") is a Florida Corporation that was established in June 1989 as The Boston & Pacific Company, Inc. and commenced operations seeking acquisitions in a variety of medical-related industries. In 2003, the company changed its name to Directview, Inc. and focused its operations on providing full-service video conferencing services and products. In August 2006, the Company entered into an agreement with GS Energy Corporation to acquire 100% of the outstanding capital stock of GS Carbon Trading, Inc., and in November 2006, the Company merged into GS Carbon Corporation. GS Carbon's business model was based on the trading of renewable energy and energy efficiency certificates, carbon credits, and other similar attributes. In August 2007, the Company changed its name to Seaway Valley Capital Corporation, whose operating strategy was to invest in companies in a variety of industries including those in food and beverages and hospitality. In June 2008, the Company acquired Sackets Harbor Brewing Company, which operated a microbrewery and restaurant, and in 2016 the Company changed its name to 1812 Brewing Company, Inc.

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Principles of Consolidation

These consolidated financial statements include the accounts of the Company's wholly owned subsidiaries. All significant intercompany transactions have been eliminated.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and cash in time deposits, certificates of deposit and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable/Other Receivable

Accounts Receivable are amounts due to the Company from sales or services rendered.

Notes Receivable

Accounts Receivable are executed contractual obligations to the Company reflecting amounts due for sales or services rendered by the Company.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to earnings as incurred; additions, renewals and betterments are capitalized. When property and equipment are retired or otherwise disposed of, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the respective accounts, and any gain or loss is included in operations. Depreciation of property and equipment is provided using the straight-line method over their useful lives.

Inventory

Inventory has been recorded at the lower of cost or fair market value. Revenue Recognition the Company's revenue recognition policies are in compliance with SEC Staff Accounting Bulletin ("SAB") 104.

Stock-Based Compensation

The Company accounts for its stock-based compensation in accordance with SFAS No. 123R, "Share Based Payment, an Amendment of FASB Statement no. 123." The Company recognizes in the statement of operations the grant-date fair value of stock options and other equity-based compensation issued to employees and nonemployees. There has been not stock-based compensation in the past 24 months.

Income Taxes

The Company utilizes the SFAS No. 109, "Accounting for Income Taxes," which requires the recognition of deferred tax assets and liabilities for the expected future tax consequences of events that have been included in the financial statements or tax returns. Under this method, deferred income taxes are recognized for the tax consequences in the future years of differences between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their financial reporting amounts at each period and based on enacted tax laws and statutory tax rates applicable to the periods in which the differences are expected to affect taxable income. Valuation allowances are established, when necessary, to reduce deferred tax assets to the amount expected to be realized.

Basic and Diluted Earnings per Share

Earnings per share are calculated in accordance with SFAS No. 128 ("SFAS No. 128"), "Earnings per Share." Basic earnings per share is based upon the weighted average number of common shares outstanding.

Note 3 - Going Concern

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America, which contemplates continuation of the Company as a going concern.

Note 4 - Accounts Payable

Accounts payable represent amounts owed to vendors for products and/or services rendered but not yet paid for in full.

Note 5 – Commitments and Contingencies

Risks and Uncertainties

The Company's operations are subject to significant risks and uncertainties including financial, operational and regulatory risks, including the potential risk of business failure. The Company does not have employment contracts with its key employees, including the controlling shareholders who are officers of the Company.

Legal and other matters

In the normal course of business, the Company may become a party to litigation matters involving claims against the Company, which includes matters relating to the Company's operating activities as well as past debts owed to creditors. The Company's management is aware of potentially pending or threatened assertions that could have a material effect on the Company's capital table but not its operations. The Company is currently working with creditors to resolve these issues.

As previously announced, 1812 Brewing Company, Inc. (the "Company") had been in discussions with its two convertible debenture ("CD") holders and a third-party Trillium Partners LP ("Trillium") to restructure and ultimately eliminate convertible debt, plus accrued interest, that totaled \$13,712,779 as of the period ended June 30, 2022. On October 25, 2022, the District Court of Maryland conducted a fairness hearing and approved the Settlement Agreement. The Settlement Agreement capped the CD obligations by staying further interest accrual, and if satisfied in full, the Settlement Agreement would satisfy the obligations altogether.

On July 12, 2023, the Company and Trillium entered into an agreement to end the transaction after the repayment of Trillium's first payment of \$500,000 to the original debt holders ("Tranche 1") has been made in full pursuant to the terms of the Transaction. To date, Trillium has been repaid approximately \$400,000 of the note with 835,911,933 shares of common stock of the Company having been issued.

In 2026, both original debtholders demanded from Trillium the return of their respective debts for the alleged breach of the purchase terms by Trillium. Trillium complied with the demand, and the debts have been assigned back to the respective debt holders. The Company and Trillium also entered into a Settlement Agreement whereby Trillium would receive a Note from the company of \$50,000 due in September 2026, and Trillium would cease demanding the Company's stock. As of the time of this report, Trillium is owed no more stock.

In November 2025, Paul Graham agreed to sell his convertible debentures of \$3,436,645 back to the company for a nominal amount. These convertible debentures have been eliminated. Discussions are also ongoing with Seaway Capital Partners, LLC, who hold \$9,552,644 of convertible debentures for the restructuring, reduction or possible elimination entirely.

Such number of shares may be increased or decreased by resolution of the Board of Directors; provided, however, that no decrease shall reduce the number of shares of Series E Convertible Preferred Stock to a number less than the number of shares then outstanding plus the number of shares reserved for issuance upon the exercise of outstanding options, rights or warrants or upon the conversion of any outstanding securities issued by the Corporation convertible into Series E Convertible Preferred Stock.

Section 2. Voting. The holders of the Series E Preferred Stock shall have the following voting rights: Each share of Series E Preferred Stock shall entitle the holder thereof, on all matters submitted to a vote of the stockholders of the Corporation, to that number of votes as shall be equal to the aggregate number of shares of Common Stock into which such holder's shares of Series E Preferred Stock are convertible on the record date for the stockholder action.

Section 3. Dividends. In the event that the Corporation's Board of Directors declares a dividend payable to holders of any class of stock, each holder of shares of Series E Preferred Stock shall be entitled to receive a dividend equal in amount and kind to that payable to the holder of the number of shares of the Corporation's Common Stock into which that holder's Series E Preferred Stock could be converted on the record date for the dividend.

Section 4. Liquidation. Upon the liquidation, dissolution and winding up of the Corporation, the holders of the Series E Preferred Stock shall be entitled to receive in cash out of the assets of the Corporation, whether from capital or from earnings available for distribution to its stockholders, before any amount shall be paid to the holders of Common Stock but after payment of distributions payable to the holders of the Series A Preferred Stock, the sum of one tenth of One Cent (\$0.001) per share, after which the holders of Series E Preferred Stock shall share in the distribution with the holders of the Common Stock on a pari passu basis, except that in determining the appropriate distribution of available cash among the shareholders, each share of Series E Preferred Stock shall be deemed to have been converted into the number of shares of the Corporation's Common Stock into which that holder's Series E Preferred Stock could be converted on the record date for the distribution.

Section 5. Conversion. Subject to and in compliance with the provisions of this Section 5, any shares of Series E Preferred Stock may, at any time, at the option of the holder thereof, be converted into fully paid and non-assessable shares of Common Stock (a "Conversion"). The number of shares of Common Stock to which a holder of Series E Preferred Stock shall be entitled upon the Conversion shall equal the sum of (a) the product obtained by (A) multiplying the number of Fully-Diluted Common Shares by four (4), then (B) multiplying the result by a fraction, the numerator of which will be the number of shares of Series E Preferred Stock being converted and the denominator of which will be the number of issued and outstanding shares of Series E Preferred Stock, less (b) the number of shares of Common Stock beneficially owned by the holder prior to the Conversion, including Common Stock issuable on conversion of any convertible securities beneficially owned by the holder. The term "Fully-Diluted Common Shares" means the sum of the outstanding Common Stock plus all shares of Common Stock that would be outstanding if all securities that could be converted into Common Stock without additional consideration were converted on the Conversion Date, but shall not include Common Stock issuable on conversion of the Series E Preferred Stock.

(i) **Conversion Notice.** The holder of a share of Series E Preferred Stock ("Holder") may exercise its conversion right by giving a written conversion notice (the "Conversion Notice") (A) by facsimile to the Corporation confirmed by a telephone call or (B) by overnight delivery service, with a copy by facsimile to the Corporation's transfer agent for its Common Stock, as designated by the Corporation from time to time (the "Transfer Agent") and to its counsel, as designated by the Corporation from time to time. If such conversion will result in the conversion of all of the Holder's Series E Preferred Stock, the Holder shall also surrender the certificate for its Series E Preferred Stock to the Corporation at its principal office (or such other office or agency of the Corporation which it may designate by notice in writing to the Holder) at any time during its usual business hours on the date set forth in the Conversion Notice.

(ii) **Issuance of Certificates; Time Conversion Effected.**

A. Promptly, but in no event more than three (3) "Trading Days," (defined herein as a day on which the New York Stock Exchange is open for the trading of securities) after the receipt of the Conversion Notice referred to in Subsection 5 (i) and surrender of the Series E Preferred Stock certificate (if required), the Corporation shall issue and deliver, or the Corporation shall cause to be issued and delivered to the Holder, registered in such name or names as the Holder may direct, a certificate or certificates for the number of whole shares of Common Stock into which the Series E Preferred Stock has been converted. In the alternative, if the Corporation's Transfer Agent is a participant in the electronic book transfer program, the Transfer Agent shall credit such aggregate number of shares of Common Stock to which the Holder shall be entitled to the Holder's or its designee's balance account with The Depository Trust Corporation. Such Conversion shall be deemed to have been effected, and the "Conversion Date" shall be deemed to have occurred, on the date on which such Conversion Notice shall have been received by the Corporation and at the time specified stated in such Conversion Notice, which must be during the calendar day of such notice. The rights of the Holder of the Series E Preferred Stock shall cease, and the person or persons in whose name or names any certificate or certificates for shares of Common Stock shall be issuable upon such Conversion shall be deemed to have become the holder or holders of record of the shares represented thereby, on the Conversion Date. Issuance of shares of Common Stock issuable upon conversion that are requested to be registered in a name other than that of the registered Holder shall be subject to compliance with all applicable federal and state securities laws.

B. The Corporation understands that a delay in the issuance of the shares of Common Stock beyond three (3) Trading Days after the Conversion Date could result in economic loss to the Holder of the Series E Preferred Stock. As compensation to the Holder for such loss, the Corporation agrees to pay the Holder's actual losses occasioned by any "buy-in" of Common Stock necessitated by such late delivery. Furthermore, in addition to any other remedies that may be available to the Holder, if the Corporation fails for any reason to effect delivery of such shares of Common Stock within five (5) Trading Days after the Conversion Date, the Holder will be entitled to revoke the relevant Conversion Notice by delivering a notice to such effect to the Corporation. Upon delivery of such notice of revocation, the Corporation and the Holder shall each be restored to their respective positions immediately prior to delivery of such Conversion Notice, except that the Holder shall retain the right to receive the actual cost of any "buy-in."

(iii) **Fractional Shares.** The Corporation shall not, nor shall it cause the Transfer Agent to, issue any fraction of a share of Common Stock upon any Conversion. All shares of Common Stock (including fractions thereof) issuable upon a Conversion of shares of Series E Preferred Stock by the Holder shall be aggregated for purposes of determining whether the Conversion would result in the issuance of a fraction of a share of Common Stock. If, after such aggregation, the issuance would result in the issuance of a fraction of a share of Common Stock, the Corporation shall round, or cause the Transfer Agent to round, such fraction of a share of Common Stock up to the nearest whole share.

(iv) **Reorganization, Reclassification, Consolidation, Merger or Sale.** Any recapitalization, reorganization, reclassification, consolidation, merger, sale of all or substantially all of the Corporation's assets or other transaction which is effected in such a way that holders of Common Stock are entitled to receive (either directly or upon subsequent liquidation) stock, securities or assets with respect to or in exchange for Common Stock is referred to herein as an "Organic Change."
